## **2. Conference rules**

**About the time of presentation:** The **MAXIMUM** time of presentation for every paper is 15 minutes. There can be one or two presenters for every paper. The **MAXIMUM** time of discussion of every session is 30 minutes.

### **Submission of PPT**

LCD projectors are available in every conference room. The Program Committee urges all conference participants to ensure that use of this technology does not interrupt or delay a session. With a strict time limit for panel sessions, even a minor delay can greatly hamper the success of a panel.

**Otherwise, please make sure you upload your PPT onto the conference computer at least 10 minutes before your session begins.**

Contents and Format of Presentation Slides: Try to economize on the number of slides in a presentation. Slides should be readable from at least 30 feet, and should be displayed long enough for viewers actually to comprehend the message they are supposed to convey. A good rule of thumb is one substantive slide (a key exhibit, not an outline page) for every two minutes of presentation (or no more than 6 or 7 total slides per presentation).

### **Guidelines for chairs**

The chair can be critical to the success of a session. The principal challenge for a chair is to enforce time allotments. A presenter that runs over his or her allotted time is using time that belongs to another presenter or to the audience. Chairs should do the following:

- Know about the panel papers, make sure that all presenters are present and all PPTs are on the computer before the session begins.
- Start the session on time and state the ground rules at the beginning of the discussion, including timing.
- Introduce all participants at the beginning of the session.
- Monitor the clock. Presenters who appear to be off-track for completion on time should be cautioned mid-presentation. The student volunteer will use signs that read "3" and "0" (meaning 3 minutes left and no time left) to help alert presenters.
- Be prepared to initiate the question period if the audience is not engaged and ensure that questions and statements from the audience are short and to the point. Encourage the audience to identify themselves before asking a question.
