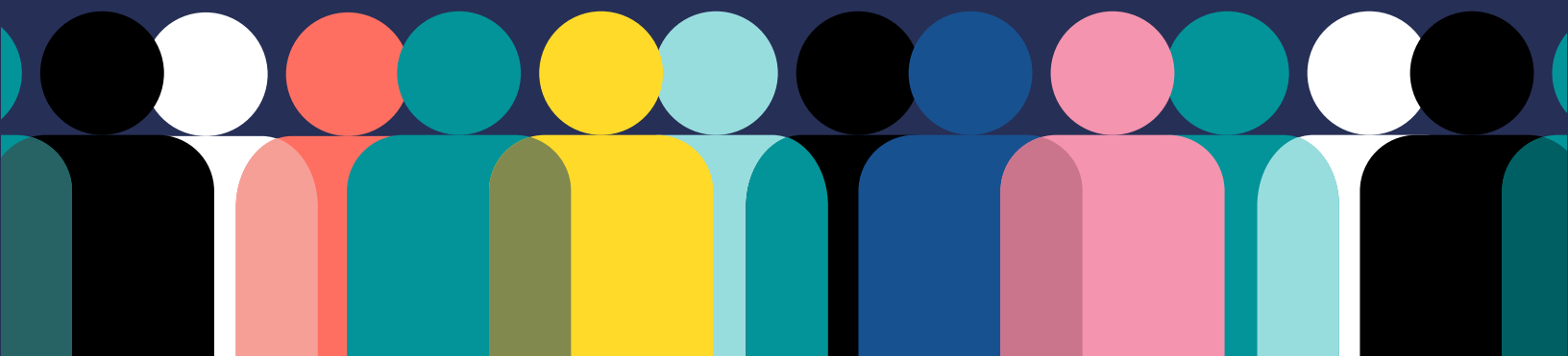

APPAM is committed to diversity, equity, and inclusion in all facets of our work and administers a variety of programs focusing on diversity, equity and inclusion (DEI), including a mentoring program, public policy camps, and the annual Equity and Inclusion Fellowship for both students and young professionals.

The Equity and Inclusion Fellowship Program is in its seventh year and in that time, has awarded travel fellowships to more than 400 underrepresented public policy students to travel to the Annual Fall Research Conference. The 2023 cohort of 50+ underrepresented students and young professionals will be in Atlanta, hoping to make connections with future employers.

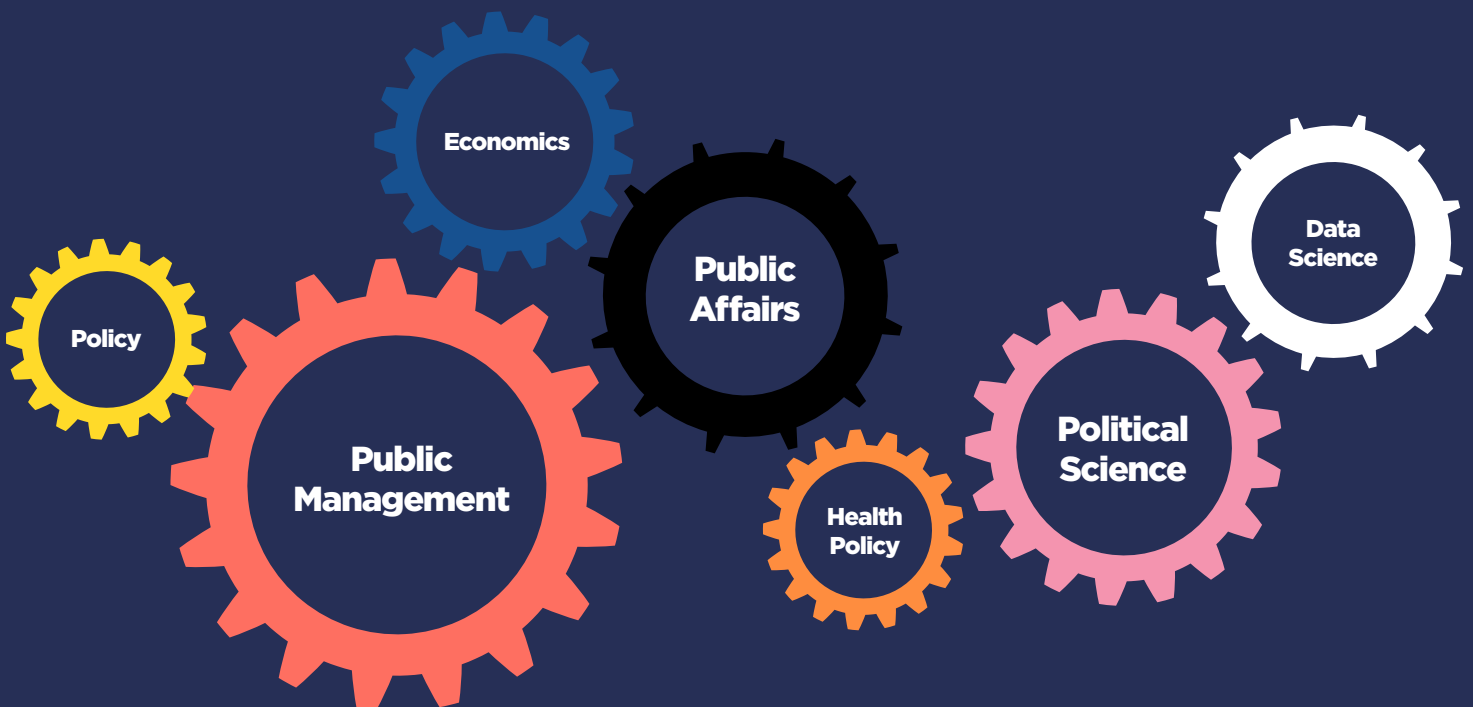


Who are APPAM Student Members?
