

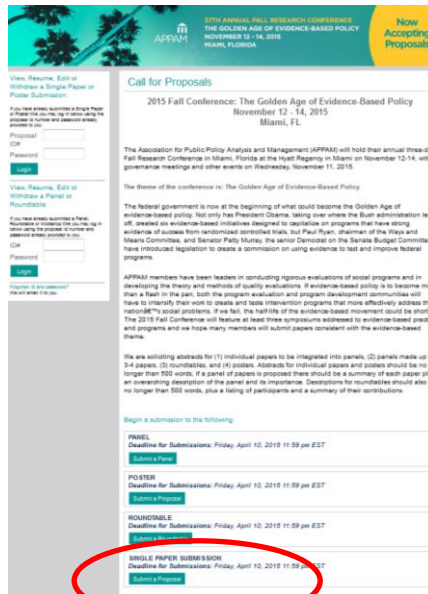

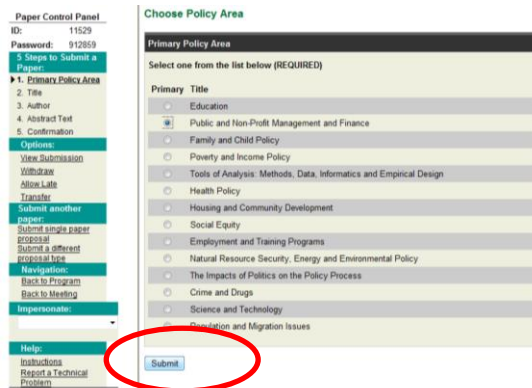

How to Submit a Paper

1. Open the Call for Proposals page: <https://appam.confex.com/appam/2015/cfp.cgi>. Then, click 'Submit a Proposal' under the Single Paper Submission option.



2. **Primary Policy Area:** You will be asked to select a policy area. You may only select one area for submission. After selecting the appropriate area, click 'Submit' at the bottom of the screen.



3. **Paper Title:** You will be asked to enter information on your paper. Please note that all communications from APPAM regarding this paper will only be sent to the email address provided as 'Submitter's Email Address'. No other authors from the paper submission will receive communications from APPAM. After entering the information and answer the questions, click 'Save and Continue'.

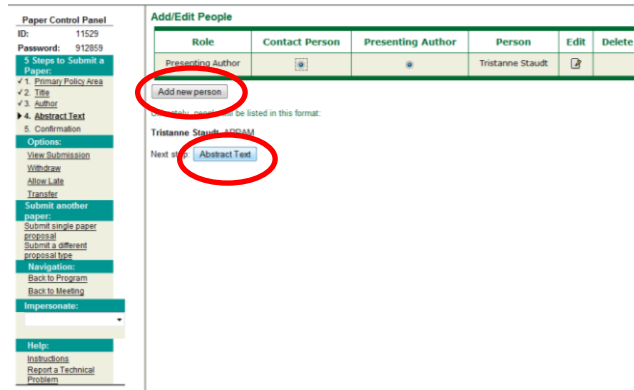

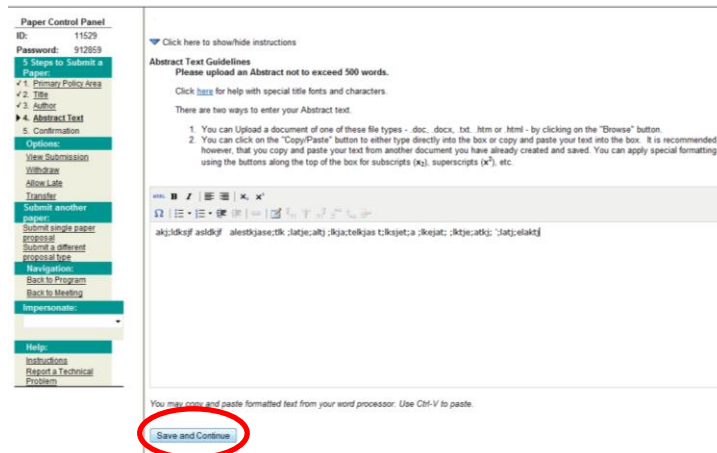

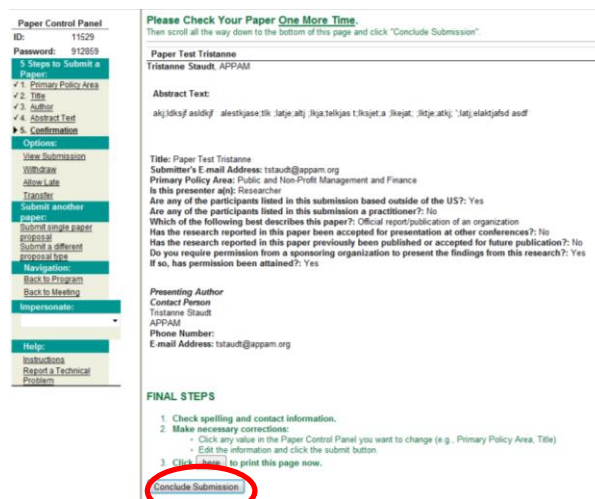
As you select the individuals, they will all show on the screen like below. To add more than one author, click 'Add new person'. Once all authors have been added, click 'Abstract Text'.
